At Alvanley and Manley Village School we have used the Primary PE and Sport Funding to improve the quality and breadth of our PE and sport provision. We ensure high quality of teaching and learning in PE, we encourage our pupils to adopt healthy, active lifestyles and encourage them to take part and compete in a wide range of sports activities and tournaments.

Plans for 2024-25

- Continue to use Sports Coach to deliver high quality PE provision to our children with CPD opportunities for teachers. Work with coach to team teach some sessions.
- Continue to enter all FAVSP sporting events and festivals giving as many children the opportunity to participate in sport at a level that is right for them.
- Work to ensure all Year 6 children meet the target of swimming 25metres competently by the end of the year. (possible top up sessions?)
- Pupil voice to gauge interest in a variety of after school clubs
